About the Artists

Annie Bielski (b. 1990) is an artist, writer, and performer. Bielski's paintings, sculpture, and video have been exhibited at NADA, New York; Art Rio, Rio de Janeiro; Burning in Water, NYC; SEPTEMBER, Hudson; Paris London Hong Kong, Chicago; High Tide, Philadelphia; Lodos Gallery, Mexico City; and The Portland Institute of Contemporary Art, Portland. Bielski has performed at SEPTEMBER, Basilica Hudson, The Museum of Modern Art, Rachel Uffner Gallery, and CANADA. She has collaborated with musician Jenny Hval and performed across the US and Europe. Her work and performances have been covered by Art News, Hyperallergic, MTV, and The New York Times. She received a BFA with an emphasis in Painting and Drawing from The School of the Art Institute of Chicago. She is a current MFA candidate at the University at Buffalo where she also teaches. Maria Guzmán Capron lives and works in Berkeley, CA. She received her BFA from the University of Houston in 2004, an MFA from California College of the Arts (CCA) in 2015. Whitney Hubbs is a photographer who explores both straightforward and uncertain modes of image production. Hubbs was involved in the punk rock riot grrrl community from a young age, where she made fanzines, organized art shows, participated in performances and worked as an activist. She later received her BFA from the California College of Arts in 2005 and an MFA at UCLA in 2009. She is an Assistant Professor of Photography at Alfred University and is represented by M+B Gallery in Los Angeles and Situations Gallery in New York City. Courtney Johnson is an artist living and working in San Francisco. Selected exhibitions include projects shown with Fused Space, San Francisco; Alter Space Gallery, San Francisco; Royal Nonesuch Gallery, Oakland; and Steve Turner Contemporary, Los Angeles. Elle Pérez is an artist from the Bronx, NY who works primarily in photography. Pérez has held solo exhibitions at MoMA PS1, New York; and 47 Canal, New York. Their work has been exhibited at The Stonewall National Museum & Archives, Ft. Lauderdale, and the Bronx Documentary Center, New York, among other venues. Pérez is a founding member of Junte, a local and international artist collective and visual art project based out of Adjuntas, Puerto

Julian Perez (b. 1993 in Dunkirk, NY) lives in Buffalo, NY. He studied photography and sculpture, receiving a Bachelor of Fine Arts in the latter from the State University of New York at Fredonia. Stephanie Rohlfs is an Oakland-based artist.
