Spring 2024 Conference Topic

Economic consequences of traffic congestion pricing in Lower Manhattan All undergraduate economics majors and all MA/MS students in Economics are eligible and invited to participate.

➢Non-economics majors with sufficient economics background are also welcome. Participating students will present their papers in a conference format near the end of the Spring semester.

The best and runner-up papers, selected by a faculty panel of judges, will be awarded \$3,000 and \$2,000 respectively.

Two ways to participate

Way one:

- For Economics BA students seeking upper-level elective course credit: Submit a registration form for Spring 2024 to enroll in Undergraduate Research (ECO 498, section SAEC, registration #23625).
- For Economics Masters students seeking elective course credit: Submit a registration form for Spring 2024 to enroll in 1, 2, or 3 credits of Graduate Independent Research (ECO 598, section SAEC, registration #23626).
- Students enrolled as above will receive a grade for the course on their transcript. They will still have an opportunity to be chosen as a winner of one of the available awards if they present their paper at the conference.

Two ways to paticipate

Way two:

➢ If you do not register for ECO 498 or ECO 598 as described in previous page.

> You can still participate in the conference and compete to win the best or runner-up paper award.

> Just prepare your paper and present it at the conference.

- ➢All participating students, whether Econ or non-Econ majors should plan to attend three hour long presentations early in the Spring 2024 semester. The schedule of these presentations are on the next page.

Attend three hour-long presentations in the first three weeks of the Spring 2024 semester

Presentation 1: Professor Justin Downs will present the economic reasoning behind the policy of pricing traffic congestion.

Presentation 2: Professor Alex Anas will present a summary of how congestion pricing fared in Singapore, London, Stockholm, Milan.

Presentation 3: Professor Aisling Winston will explain and provide guidelines on how to write a successful conference paper.

Conference scheduling

All conference papers will be due by the last day of classes in the spring 2024 semester. Papers must be double spaced pdf files. Poorly prepared papers will not be accepted.

➤ The conference will be held on the first day after the final exams. Each presenter will have 20 minutes to present her/his paper in person, using a power point presentation. The presentations will be attended by the faculty panel of judges.

> Winners will be announced within two weeks after the conference.
