

What do I do if/when...

A law enforcement agent(s) comes to my department/classroom/office?

- Ask the agents/officers for their names and identification such as a badge number
- Offer the agents/officers a place to wait.
- Call University Police (UPD) at 716-645-2222.
- Please defer to <u>General Counsel</u> regarding any discussion of the issue at hand.
- UPD will handle further interactions with the agents/officers.
- UPD will contact UB Office of General Counsel.

I am scheduled to travel outside the US and am not a US citizen (work visa or green card holder)?

- Check any federal <u>Travel Advisories</u>.
- Reach out to <u>UB Immigration Services</u> (<u>UBIS</u>) or (716) 645-2355 for a private one-on-one Zoom meeting with Oscar Budde, Esq. (email to <u>immsvcga@buffalo.edu</u>).
- Submit <u>electronic preapproval request</u> through Concur (for university faculty and staff traveling on UB business).
- Contact <u>International Student Services</u> with any questions or concerns regarding international student travel.

I want to stay informed on campus resources and guidance regarding new federal policies and actions?

• Navigate to the university's <u>website here</u> to stay informed of recent changes and university communications and guidance.

I've been notified that my federal funding is being terminated or I received a "stop work order" or my federal program officer reached out to me regarding my grant or contract?

- Email **Murthy Ganapathy**, Associate Dean for Research, College of Arts and Sciences (<u>sg82@buffalo.edu</u>) with a copy of the correspondence/communication received from the funding agency. Please be ready to provide details about any immediate impact on personnel appointments.
- Copy the Office of the Vice President for Research and Economic Development (OVPRED) <u>vpr@research.buffalo.edu</u>. Sponsored Projects Services (SPS) will provide guidance on

implementing any orders and will handle any necessary follow-up (including appeals) with funding agencies.

• Navigate to the <u>Federal Agency Transition Guidance website</u> updated by OVPRED for information and guidance.

I receive a phone call or visit from someone claiming to be from a media outlet or seeking information?

- Direct any media inquiry or request, unrelated to your area of research expertise to <u>John Della</u> <u>Contrada</u>, Vice President for University Communications, email: <u>dellacon@buffalo.edu</u>.
- Copy Gina Cali-Misterkiewicz, Assistant Dean for Marketing and Communication, College of Arts and Sciences (<u>ginacali@buffalo.edu</u>) on any correspondence to University Communications.
- Contact University Police (UPD) at 716-645-2222 if a visitor becomes hostile or refuses to leave.

My class is disrupted by a student or outside visitor?

- Ask any outside visitors to leave the class so as not to interfere with your students' educational experience. Should an outside visitor refuse to leave, contact (UPD) at 716-645-2222.
- Navigate to <u>Behavioral Expectations in the Learning Space</u> website for guidance.
- Remind students of the Student Code of Conduct.
- Navigate to the <u>UB Students of Concern Procedures</u> website for guidance to support students who may be negotiating difficult life events or display concerning behaviors.
- Contact University Police (UPD) at 716-645-2222 if there is a disruption in your class that you are unable to deescalate and/or escalates beyond what is safe.

I believe that I am a target of discrimination or harassment, or I believe that someone has made a false complaint about me?

- Contact UB's <u>Office of Equity, Diversity and Inclusion</u> to report any discrimination or harassment. The reporting procedure is available for all members of the University community, including students, faculty and staff.
- Contact Donte McFadden (<u>dontemcf@buffalo.edu</u>), Unit Diversity Officer for the College of Arts and Sciences for guidance and referral.
- Review UB's <u>Workplace Violence and Bullying Prevention</u> and <u>Discrimination and Harassment</u> <u>Policy</u> for more information and guidance.

UB employees or students need support or services for dealing with unusual stress or stressors?

- Contact the <u>Employee Assistance Program</u> (EAP) for confidential consultation or one-on-one meetings at no charge to UB employees. EAP provides referrals to specialists and/or general information on how to help manage personal and/or work-related concerns.
