K-pop: Digital Circulation of Intimacy

and Postcolonial Desires

Stephanie Choi is a postdoctoral associate at the Asia Research Institute, investigating the global circulation of K-pop. For her ethnographic research, Choi conducted participant-observation interviews with more than 70 participants in the Kpop world—including industry workers (CEOs, A&R directors. idol recruiters, managers, and reporters), idol singers, and fans in Seoul, Los Angeles, and New York. In this talk. Choi explores K-pop singers as service how workers provide intimacy their to fans and further investigates how this form of intimate labor is translated in the American racial politics.

Dr. Choi earned her PhD in 2020 in ethnomusicology from the University of California-Santa Barbara, where her dissertation focused on gender, labor, and the commodification of intimacy in K-pop.
