## Milton Plesur Awards for Study Abroad Schoellkopf Award for Study Abroad

The History Department is pleased to offer several Milton Plesur Awards for Study Abroad, made possible by the endowment of Milton Plesur, a long-time Professor in the History Department, and one Schoellkopf Award for Study Abroad, made possible by the generosity of Frederick J. Schoellkopf in memory of his wife Toby Bloom Schoellkopf, a graduate of UB's History Department.

Each year the Department will award scholarships to each of four to seven qualified History majors or joint-majors who meet the following requirements:

- 1. are currently enrolled, full-time, matriculated students in good standing at the University of Buffalo;
- 2. have applied for admission to a recognized program for full-time study abroad for full academic credit for a summer, a semester, or an academic year;
- 3. are recommended by a University at Buffalo faculty member familiar with their work (by means of a letter of recommendation).

## Preference will be give to students who:

- 1. are studying abroad for the first time;
- 2. are enrolling in a study-abroad program administered by the University at Buffalo;
- 3. will return to the University at Buffalo for at least one semester to assist in promoting international education, including writing a final report of between 500 and 1,000 words describing and evaluating the experience.

Applications should be submitted to the Undergraduate Office of the History Department, 540 Park Hall.

The deadline for submission for: Summer and Fall academic year programs is **March 15**; Winter session and Spring semester is **Nov. 1**.

Announcements of grants will be made soon after the application deadlines. Funds will be disbursed upon receipt by the Undergraduate Studies Office of a letter of admission to the study abroad program.
