More than 10% of the population of the city of Buffalo was born outside of the United States. Nearly half of them arrived in the US since 2010. Some have moved here for work, for study, or to reunite with family. Others came here to flee persecution, violence, and war. The new arrivals are helping to revitalize our community, fostering economic growth, innovation, and cultural diversity. However, integrating new arrivals presents challenges. Immigrants and refugees often face financial strain, language barriers, and trauma from past experiences. This deliberative forum aims to explore what it means to build an inclusive community. We seek to identify actionable steps for individuals and civic organizations to create a robust support system and address barriers to inclusion.
